Things to remember

- Many Washington state universities and colleges require: **TWO** years of a single foreign language taken in high school or **TWO** quarters at a community college for admission.
- Depending on your major, you may need a third quarter to graduate with your bachelor’s degree.
- **Be a competitive applicant.** If your major requires it, finish the third quarter here at BC before transferring. It will look great on your transcript.
- Any student who can demonstrate he/she is bilingual may meet the foreign language admission and graduation requirements. Consult your school(s) of choice for verification.

The World Languages Department has an informal assessment to determine student placement for world language courses above the first level.
